Dear Gilpin School Community,

Governor Jared Polis issued a ***Stay At Home*** order on March 25. However, schools are exempt when providing essential services: “K-12 public and private schools for the purpose of providing meals, housing, facilitating or providing materials for distance learning, and providing other essential services to students.”

To facilitate essential services for students to participate in distance (remote) learning, we will provide families the opportunity to come to the school to pick up any items they may have left at the school such as supplies, medication, and technology on Monday, March 30, 2020, from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. The main entrance is the entry point. Entry to the school will be limited to 10 or less people at one time. And, social distancing of 6 feet or more is required.

Only medication from the Health Office and needed items for distance (remote) learning will be available. For parents/students, coming to the school is voluntary. If you don't need items for distance (remote) learning, do not come to the school.

Superintendent David MacKenzie will host a Town Hall meeting via WebEx on Wednesday, April 1, 2020, at 6:10 p.m. to answer Gilpin School Community member questions. Participants will submit questions via the Chat function. An invitation and link to the meeting will be sent in a separate email next week.
